



Summary of the RCOB Meeting Held on July 25th, **2024**

The meeting commenced at 12:30 pm with the singing of the National Anthem and the Rotary Grace.

The meeting was a fellowship meeting.

There was a single guest present – Kareem Hackett, brother of and guest of Rtn Chrispen Hackett.

After lunch our guest speaker Charielle Plowden of Wizdom CRM Limited, and her team joined us via Zoom to speak on "Artificial Intelligence".

She was introduced by PP Robin Ford.

Charielle spoke a bit about Wizdom CRM Limited and the work it does and the service it provides. She explained that it is an Edutech company that covers the region. Its goal is to improve student learning outcomes. She explained that one of its focuses is to teach children about investing on the stock exchange, by providing them with virtual money to "invest" on various regional stock exchanges, using AI. They had primary, secondary and tertiary students working with the programme, all learning financial literacy.

They are aligned with the CSEC curriculum for POA, POB and Management Studies, and have partnered with the stock exchanges of Jamaica, Trinidad and Tobago and Barbados, and work with the Ministries of Education in Guyana, Trinidad and Tobago, Jamaica and Barbados.

They educate children to save, budget and invest, working with the Ministries of Education in the islands.

They tour the schools to tell them about the platform, demonstrate them and tell them how to get started.

The team took the Club through the website and showed the Club how it worked, introducing the virtual AI powered tutors such as the "Bark" Tutor and the "Mr. Rabbit" tutor for the younger students, and Isabella for the older students. There is a sign language component for those students needing it as well, and those students having problems with reading can be assisted by the "Bark Tutor" which can provide audio feedback.

The platform provides assistance for students who can't afford a private tutor, but by using the platform can now have private tutoring through the use of AI. 7816 students participated from April - June this year. The platform provides analytics for the Ministries of Education, and the parents of the children, allowing the students' performance to be analyzed to check their level of understanding and engagement so that they can support them. The platform can assist Ministries of Education based on country and by school and by student, with a timely KPI report, a number one driving factor for the Ministries. Sponsors also get a report.

Charielle demonstrated how the platform could give help to a 9-year old student struggling with math and English, explaining that students provide their age on signing up so that the answers to questions are age appropriate.

After the presentation the floor was opened for questions. Rotarian Simone asked how the platform dealt with students with disabilities, and AI biases. Charielle responded that students on signing up would indicate their disability and the biases were dealt with by training the AI with data for the Caribbean, including the CSEC and CAPE syllabus for Trinidad, Barbados, Guyana and Jamaica. They also used the Digital Ocean platform to ensure security of data and a backup in case of hacking.

PE Jeff Evelyn gave the vote of thanks.

Due to the length of the meeting the announcements and bingo were deferred.

The meeting ended at 1:48 pm.
