LAUNCH OF S.T.E.M. 4GIRLS

Last Thursday RCOB together with a team from IBM and the University of the West Indies and the Ministry of Education, RCOB launched the STEM 4Girls workshop which is scheduled to commence on March 12, 2018.

This workshop will allow approximately 30 girls whose ages range between 12 and 14 to attend workshops at the University of the West Indies Cave Hill Campus designed to stimulate interest and development of girls in the science and technology fields.

In addressing the Club, Dean of the Faculty of Science, Dr. Colin Depradine noted that there was no doubt that there is a dearth of females who both study and work in technologically focused areas. The Dean noted that in the Faculty of Computer Sciences the staff is nearly all male; that female graduates tend to drop out of technologically driven careers within the first two years of starting same. Given these findings the Dean noted that workshops to stimulate the interest of girls in the study of science, technology and mathematics was key.

President Paul in launching the project noted Rotary's dedicated service worldwide and in Barbados. In particular President Paul noted hat this project would be "a transformative piece in the cognitive wheel" of our children's education and for our country.


