RESPONSE TO THE MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS IN THE YOUTH IN BARBADOS.

IDENTIFYING THE PROBLEM:

-a large percentage of young people are presenting with behavioural problems; - violence, dysfunctional behavior etc. There is therefore a need to recognise that when a child presents with a dysfunctional problem that child may have other challenges:

A MULTILEAYERED INTERVENTION SUGGESTED BY PRES. LISA

Layer One: RCOB partnering with Mental Health Professionals in schools

Layer Two: School lunch program for children in need
Peer Network support services

Layer Three Home food provision program for families
Family Counseling intervention to attempt to diagnose and address challenge

Layer four Annual Youth Summit.

MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM DESCRIPTION FOR RCOB:

1. To promote students resilience, emotional and social well-being
2. To ensure early identification of mental health needs
3. To offer timely access to mental health services to address social, emotional or behavioural issues
4. To promote school and life success through improved social and emotional maturity
5. To formalise referral and feedback systems between school counselors and mental health services
6. To partner with families and non-governmental organizations and social welfare agencies
7. To address social determinants of students' mental health

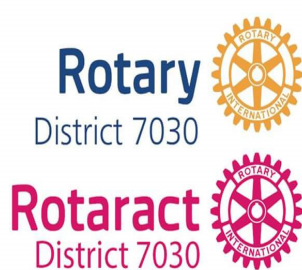

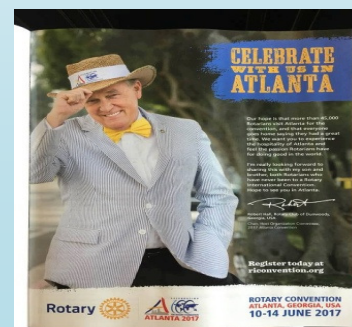
