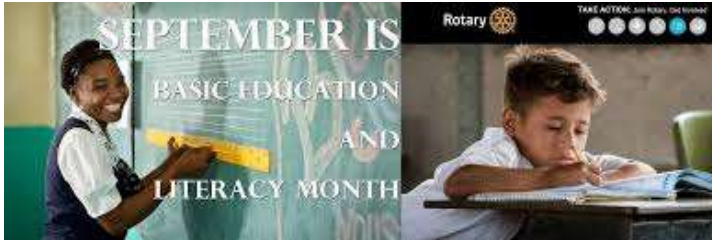

### Summary of the RCOB Fellowship Meeting Held on September 1st, 2022

Past President's Day, September 01, 2022

As is a Tradition in the Rotary Club of Barbados, Past President's Day is celebrated to give the sitting President a Day off to Refresh and recharge. In recent years the month of September – has been September Remember the contributions of Past Presidents.

Past Presidents get another chance to shine as they do on the occasion of the Installation.

This year the Meeting for the President of the Day was managed by PP Erskine Thompson (2010-11) with SAA duties conducted by PP Anthony Reece (2005-06) and the recap of the Club Project by PP Shawn Franklin (2018-19)

1. PP Erskine welcomed us to the 8<sup>th</sup> regular meeting of the Rotary Year.
2. The National Anthem and The Rotary Grace were both rendered by the Club.
3. PP Tony Reece, Sergeant at Arms introduced the Guests and Visiting Rotarians.
4. Foundation Minute. PP Elvin Sealy.
5. Dr. Zulikat Wuraola Abiola, RC Lagos, brought Greetings from her Club. She was here attending the inaugural AfriCaribbean Trade and Investment Forum at the Lloyd Erskine Sandiford Centre. The theme is – 'One People. One Destiny. Uniting and Reimagining Our Future'

The thrust of the Forum is the Expanding African-Caribbean Trade. She quoted the President of the African Export-Import Bank (Afreximbank), Professor Benedict Oramah, who spoke of the need to change the narrative on Trade being a force of Good or Evil, but being seen as a force for good with embracing the opportunities of East-West engagement instead of only relying on the US & UK. Air links have been a barrier to trade which must be removed. There are many developmental opportunities in Africa, including Oil & Gas.

6. PP Shawn gave an Overview of his year. Sanitation for the Disabled

This project sought to provide appropriate bathroom facilities and Safe Room in the home in case of a disaster. Three homes were completed.

- Ms. Douglin is eighty (80) years old and lives alone in a small three-room wooden house. She is wheelchair bound.
- Ms. Bowen is 60 years old and lives alone in a two-room house which she owns. She is legally blind with rapidly deteriorating health problems with her eyes and is severely diabetic.
- Ms. Ince is 54 years old. She has had a spinal injury since 2008 and walks with the assistance of an orthopaedic cane.
- PP Shawn thanked Former Rotarian Willie Kirton for coordinating the efforts.

- (4) President Tracey proposes a Toast to all Past Presidents.
