Today's Meeting is a Fellowship Meeting

Rotary International President Barry Rassin visits Dominica.

International President Barry Rassin accompanied by his wife Esther, Past District Governor David Edwards of Barbados, current District Governor Dominique Vénére of Guadeloupe, Past District Governor Roger Bose of Trinidad and Tobago and District Governor Nominee Lisle Chase of St. Lucia, visited Dominica on August 7 and 8, 2018.

The group was met on arrival at Douglas Charles Airport on Tuesday, August 7, by Assistant Governor Sammy Wyke, President of the Rotary Club of Dominica, Cecil Shillingford and President of the Rotary Club of Portsmouth, Hans Schilders.

The group visited a number of projects being undertaken by both Dominica Clubs to include housing, education and fisheries projects, a plastic recycling project of the Rotary Club of Portsmouth and the Grotto Home project which is receiving assistance from the Rotary Club of Dominica as well as a proposed Massacre Primary School Student's walkway and bus Shelter repairs of the Rotary Club of Dominica. The Rotary Clubs of Barbados sent a special gift.

They also met with members of the Rotary Clubs and the Rotaract Club of Roseau and the Interact Club of the St. Martin's Primary School at a cocktail event which was addressed by R. I. President Barry. RI President Barry also pinned new Rotarians of both Clubs as well as new Paul Harris Fellows.

RI President Barry was also carded to call on the President of Dominica, H. E. Charles Savarin and Government Officials before departing Dominica on Wednesday afternoon, August 8, 2018.



President Shawn, Secretary Neal along with Directors Makonem, Adrian and Malcolm attended a meeting of the Rotaract Club of Barbados on Tuesday August 7th at McEneaney Quality Inc, to share with its members the activities and projects planned by RCOB for this Rotary Year.

Based on feedback received, there will be opportunities once again for the clubs to work jointly on some of the projects.



It was a business meeting with a slight twist. In keeping with the festivities across the island, ASAA Heather challenged each table to offer up a rendition and table four (4) with lead singer PP Alex was the clear winner running away with the title. The Directors updated the club on their agenda for the year.

Director Adrian - International/Rotary Foundation

- Increasing awareness of Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) syndrome through early intervention, by providing CPR classes and defibrillators.
- Focusing on September 29 which is Heart day and February which is Heart month.
- Encouraging newer members to attend District Conference in Guadeloupe, April 24-27 and International Convention in Hamburg Germany, June 1-5.
- PDG David is assisting with applications to Rotary Foundation for District and Global grants to support scholarships.

Director Makonem - Membership/Youth Service

- Beach clean up in September in conjunction with the Rotaractors and Interactors.
- The annual Youth Forum is now in its third consecutive year and will be held at the Barbados Light and Power conference room.
- All the youth clubs will be assisting in Carols by Candlelight in December
- Our club has been asked to host the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA), which is a joint club event, in May 2019.
- Rotaractors will be assisting with the ongoing Sustainable Living project, installing kitchen garden kits to deserving households.
- The Rotaractors will also be assisting with Model United Nations (MUN), another joint club effort.
- The District Governor will be visiting between the 27-30 and will be meeting with the various youth clubs.

Director Malcolm - Community Service

- The process is on the way for the selection of Rotary Peace Ambassadors.
- The Vocational Service Awards (formerly Pride of Workmanship Awards) will be held in October and there is a special focus on persons who offer mentorship to youths.
- The date for the annual beach clean up will be announced.

Director Tracey - Public Relations

- Promoting the Rotary brand across the country began with the media coverage of the Installation Ceremony.

- The Sanitation For The Disabled project is in its early stages and currently costing and design is being obtained from builders.
- The initial assessment of the housing structures has shown that some of them are not structurally sound, as a result a decision was made to construct the indoor sanitary units to also serve as a safe room in case of emergencies such as hurricanes.

Other Business

PP Grenville raised the issue of the Governor General being the Patron of the Club and the name of the Governor General being so listed on the weekly bulletin. The matter is being looked into.
