Lionel was the longest serving Treasurer of the Club from 1989-2001. He has also served as the Chair of the Classification and Membership Committee. Currently he serves on the Club Bulletin and Donations & Investigations committees. He has served the District as Treasurer on a number of occasions; including 2015-16. His service to the community was recognized with the Paul Harris Award in 1997.

RTN. PETER HERMANT transferred to the Rotary Club of Barbados on May 19, 1994 from The Rotary Club of Toronto, where he had been a member for about 20 years. His Classification is Business Services—International Trade. He had left Toronto because he was posted to the Canadian High Commission in Barbados as a Trade Commissioner. He is happy that the Club was “kind enough to agree to let me re-join Rotary”. He was Chair of the International Service Committee from 2003-2007.
