He writes, “When the great depression hit in 1930, many Rotarians faced the greatest challenge of their lives. There was no better time to test for ethical conduct than during such a dire economic crisis and the scramble to survive”.

Even more compelling than Rotary faced in the great depression, the realities of the Covid-19 Pandemic provided an opportunity for all Rotarians to test our ethical conduct.
