Rotary Foundation Minute

PEE Arlene delivered the Rotary Foundation Minute. David C. Forward in his Book "A Century of Service" writes a Chapter on Vocational Service recommended reading for all Rotarians. As we now try to navigate life with the realities of the Covid-19 Pandemic it is instructive to study the development of the Four Way Test. He writes, "When the great depression hit in 1930, many Rotarians faced the greatest challenge of their lives. There was no better time to test for ethical conduct than during such a dire economic crisis and the scramble to survive".

Two standards developed by Rotarians - The Four-Way Test and the Rotarian Code of Conduct — provide a road map for ethical behavior in the workplace and other areas of life. The Rotarian Code of Conduct provides a framework for ethical behavior that all Rotarians can use, together with The Four-Way Test, in their business and professional activities. Even more compelling than Rotary faced in the great depression, the realities of the Covid-19 Pandemic provided an opportunity for all Rotarians to test our ethical conduct.




