We started the year with President Robin choosing 17 out of 25 plans outlined by Rotary International. Of the 17 goals, RCOB achieved 14 of these with membership, sponsorship and sponsorship for RYLA being areas that were not achieved to satisfaction.

Of note are donations to the Foundation which we exceeded by \$2,000 and Polio Plus Fund contributions which were also pleasantly exceeded.

Attendance for the past year averaged 73.97% and it was hoped for the month of June, we will have full attendance to better last years.

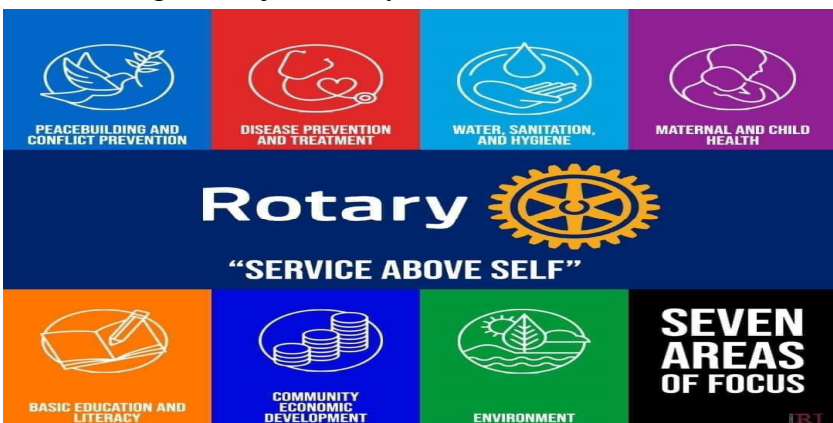
Cloud storage in the form of Dropbox is now available for archiving of information and club history complete with a table of contents and a Manual of Procedures.

The Rotary Foundation Cadre of Technical Advisers is a group of Rotary members who volunteer to use their professional skills and technical expertise in Rotary's areas of focus or financial auditing to advise Rotary members who are planning and working on Rotary Foundation grant projects. The Cadre is composed of more than 500 members from 75 countries who speak more than 80 languages.

How they can help:

Cadre members can assist your project by:

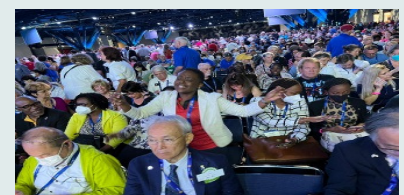
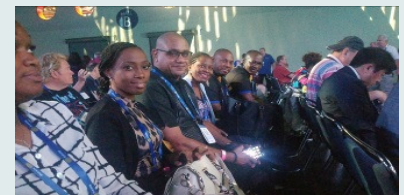
1. Providing project planning advice and implementation guidance
2. Designing community assessments
3. Incorporating elements of sustainability into projects
4. Establishing monitoring and evaluation plans
5. Answering questions about Rotary's areas of focus
6. Providing financial management best practices

Their mission is to strengthen the impact of Rotary's grants by assisting Rotary members in planning projects and safeguarding Foundation funds. Sign in to My Rotary and run the Cadre Member Information report to find a member of the Cadre who has expertise in your project's area of focus. You can also search by language, country, and district. When you identify a Cadre member who can help with your project, contact them through the email listed in the report. (Refer to Using Grant Reports.)

What we do:

1. Serve as consultants to Rotary staff and Rotary members who are planning and implementing grant projects
2. Assist The Rotary Foundation Trustees with the grant funding process by reviewing grant applications
3. Evaluate the implementation of projects that have been funded by Foundation grants to ensure that the funds are being used properly
4. Perform programmatic audits to ensure that Foundation grant funds are being used in accordance with the terms and conditions for Rotary grants and that stewardship guidelines are followed
5. Carry out evaluations and interviews associated with Rotary's Grant Model Evaluation as well as other Rotary initiatives and partnerships
