Guest Speaker Zane Maloney



19-year-old Zane Maloney is the first ever Formula 2 driver from Barbados, and the wider Caribbean. With over 16 years of circuit racing under his belt, having started at the age of 3, Zane has continued to prove his potential and skills throughout his karting and single seater career.



- In 1919, Rotary held its first International Assembly in Chicago.
- In 1921, the first international convention outside of the USA, was held in Edinburgh, Scotland.
- In 1943, Rotary adopted the Four-Way Test.
- In January 1947, Mr. Paul Harris Rotary's founding member died after a prolonged illness. Members contributed more than \$1 million in his memory over an 18-month period. The money is used to support the Foundation's scholarship programs. In 1957, the Paul Harris Fellow recognition is established to show appreciation for and encourage substantial contributions to the Foundation.

On November 5th, 1962, the first Interact club was certified at Melbourne High School, in Florida, USA.

- In 1965, the Rotary Foundation began supporting club and district projects with matching grants, which is the first regular program to fund these service efforts.
- In 1968, Rotary certifies its first Rotaract club at the University of North Carolina in Charlotte, USA. *Rotaract was created as a program for college-age students and young professionals but in 2019 Rotaract clubs were redefined as a unique type of membership in Rotary.
- In 1971, Rotary adopts the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA). Event teaches secondary school students through young professionals' leadership, communication, and problem-solving skills.
- In 1978, Rotary develops a program to improve health, alleviate hunger, and enhance human and social development.

Rotary members use the grants to create access to clean drinking water, support literacy programs, provide medical care, and more — setting the stage for today's global grants. In 1979, a multi-year grant project to immunize children in the Philippines launches Rotary in the fight to eradicate polio. 



He also hopes to improve Rotary's process for appointments and governance.
