Summary of the RCOB Meeting Held on November 3rd, 2022

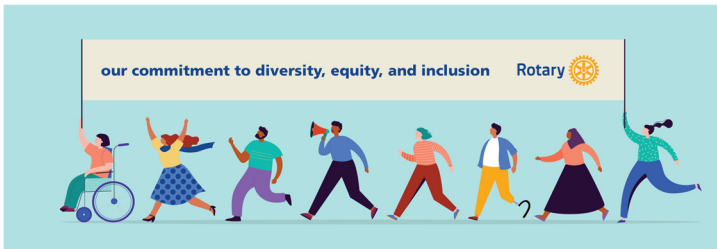
- The 14th meeting of the club year was called to order at 12.35 p.m. by President Tracey. Today's meeting was special as it was Nomination Day for club officers and directors.
