The 4th meeting of the Board was held on Monday, September 30. Directors also reported to the general membership at the Forum held on Thursday, September 26. Key highlights are as follows:

Club Administration

- Attendance: The average to date is 70%. 17 persons are under 50%.
- Fellowship: The Boat Cruise was held on September 15.
- By-Laws: The revised By-Laws are being reviewed for consistency with the new Manual of Procedure issued by RI. The By-Laws will be circulated to members in the coming weeks.

Community Service

- Pride of Workmanship Awards: The POWA Dinner is scheduled for Thursday, October 17 at the Sandals Royal. Our Patron, Her Excellency, the Governor General Dame Sandra Mason will be in attendance.
