# RECAP OF JANUARY 4, 2018 BUSINESS MEETING

The first meeting of the year was a business meeting. Dir. Malcolm Vaughn updated the Club on the annual Children's party for the disabled and disadvantaged children which is being planned for the weekend closest to Jan 21. He noted that a date had not yet been finalized and would advise the Club as soon as a date was agreed. In addition he reminded the Club of the annual MUN workshop which is scheduled to commence in March. He will also revert with precise dates and the theme for this year.

Rtn. Robin Ford advised the Club of a project with IBM and the S.T.E.M workshops (Science and Technology) . Rtn. Robin advised that a decision had been made to host a special workshop for girls so as to stimulate their interest in science and technology. The Club's role in this project is to assist in the provision of lunches for the participants.

**PE Shawn** addressed the Club on the review/ post mortem of the annual Carols By Candlelight. He noted that there were still some outstanding tickets and that this was hindering the completion of the financials relevant to this event.

PE Shawn reminded all members who had outstanding ticket monies for Carols by Candlelight to pay same as a matter of urgency to PP Robert Morris.

He also advised that in consultation with PEE Peter Williams, Carols by Candlelight 2018 will be held on Dec. 16, 2018.

**President Paul** also addressed the Club and reminded of the planned President's Party which was scheduled for January 6, 2018. Each member was also encouraged to bring a bottle noting that any drinks not used would be kept by the Club for the next function so as to obviate the need to buy drinks twice.

As such, President Paul briefly summarized the first six months noting the projects undertaken thus far and those which are scheduled for the remaining half.

- The giving of gifts to the children of the Nightengale Home, Farr's and Stirling Children's homes
- The continued teaching of some of the children at Farr's
- The hosting of the Forum for the Rotaract Clubs
- The hosting of the joint Club fellowship at Coverley where Rotarians from the three clubs and their families enjoyed a day of great food, fun and fellowship playing games ranging from tennis to football to cricket

President Paul noted the concerted effort by his team to encourage fellowship at the meetings which included the giving of special prizes on certain occasions.

He thanked his fellow Board members and advised that the next half of his term should be as exciting as the first half.

DID YOU KNOW THAT ROTARY INTERNATIONAL HAS GIVEN 49.5 MILLION DOLLARS (US CURRENCY) TO HELP ERADICATE POLIO.

A: Polio does still exist, although polio cases have decreased by over 99% since 1988, from an estimated more than 350 000 cases to 37 reported cases in 2016. This reduction is the result of the global effort to eradicate the disease. Today, only 3 countries in the world have never stopped transmission of polio (Pakistan, Afghanistan and Nigeria).

Despite the progress achieved since 1988, as long as a single child remains infected with poliovirus, children in all countries are at risk of contracting the disease. The poliovirus can easily be imported into a polio-free country and can spread rapidly amongst unimmunized populations. Failure to eradicate polio could result in as many as 200 000 new cases every year, within 10 years, all over the world.

There is no cure for polio, it can only be prevented. Polio vaccine, given multiple times, can protect a child for life.
