Being Youth Service Month we welcomed representatives from our two Interact Clubs. In addition there was a presentation by the European Commission on the 9th European Film Festival in Bar-



bados and Youth Service Director gave a summary on the just concluded 25th District Conference in Trinidad & Tobago.



President Abbien of Codrington gave a Summary of their activities thus far for the year.

1. **Food Drive** -We started the year with a food drive in an attempt to donate as much food as possible to a family with seven children.

This project was a major success because we raised three boxes full of food to donate.

2. **Button Drive-** We worked with the Barbados Cancer Society, as we sold buttons for \$2.00 each for the children's cancer project. This was also very successful and I say this because we managed to fill five(5) cans for the project and raised awareness while doing so.

3. Haiti Week- As Haiti was going through a challenging time after the hurricane, we organized a week of activities in which students would participate in for a fee. The events included a quiz and a bake sale which were held at during a lunch periods.

4. No shave November- No shave November was intended to raise money for breast cancer by asking men/young adults not to shave for a month. This project was not as successful as the others due to the fact that there are not many people who shave in our school.

Our number of students has remained mostly the same throughout the first term (10) and we have lost one member at the beginning of this term. We are currently striving for a greater number of members in this term but our club's number does not determine what we accomplish in our school.

The Board has six persons: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Head of Directors and Sergeant at Arms. At the end of last term, the Club elected a new Board. This process is necessary due to the examination term and the hectic start of term one.

Thus, we now have: President Aadijah, Vice-President Danielle, Secretary Angel, Head of Directors Shanique, Treasurer Jameca and Sergeant at Arms Kayla.

The current membership is 33. The year levels range from 2nd year to Upper sixth. There are fewer boys than girls but that has not stopped the Club from maintaining solid numbers annually.

The year 2016 – 17 was as eventful as usual for the St. Michael School's Interact Club. The club still upholds its major understanding to be a student organization seeking to fulfill its community duties through work with various other organizations to help as many as possible in our society.

The club started its year of activities in September. There was full assembly, the donation of health items to the school, the start of an account to contribute to the canteen for less fortunate students and the Interactors visited the Erdiston Special School in December and also worked at Carols by Candlelight ceremony at Christmas at the Prime Minister's. Last term the Club assisted the Variety Club with the sale of hearts, assisted at the school's Model Search and continued its work within and around the school's natural environment.
