- The water tank project was started on the 4th August at The Alleyne School. Six schools in the north are involved in this project.
 We plan to put down the concrete bases for the schools over the next ten weeks.
- The other major project is the Solar PV system being installed at the Schoolhouse For Special Needs. This starts in two weeks and will take nine weeks to complete.
- The evening lecture series is all in place. The three lectures will be held on September 23rd, October 28th and November 18th.

President Robin introduced PP Michael, who addressed the club on "We are Rotary".

Contributions continued there through PP Brenda with a \$50K equipment donation through the support of a GSE Team from the UK who were nurses- PP Erskine was the project manager and Rotarian Commander Willie Kirton co-ordinated resources from the business in the area of the District Hospital – cupboards and other furniture were donated.

We have done several other very successful projects throughout the years which are too many to mention here.

 - \$1.3 million was raised for this purpose.
- Also in 1947, the Foundation launched its program for scholarships for international graduate study?
 - This was the start of the ambassadorial scholarship program. Scholarships were
 offered worldwide for graduates and undergraduates as well as qualified
 professionals pursuing vocational studies.
 - While abroad the scholars served as ambassadors of goodwill & gave presentations about their homeland at Rotary Clubs and other groups.


