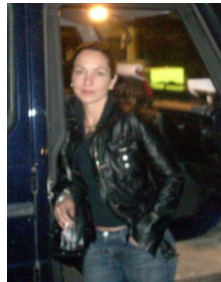
Rtn. Dr. Tracy Archer

2017 is now upon us and this year the annual District Conference is in Trinidad and Tobago..

The District Conference is the ultimate showcase for the programs and projects underway at each of the Rotary and Rotaract clubs in our District.

The Conference is broken into four distinct categories:

1. PETS Leadership Training – geared to train incoming officers of Rotary and Rotaract clubs.
2. General Assembly and Conferences—open to all Rotarians and Rotaractors to learn about new developments and projects
3. Daily Excursions—offered to Rotarians, Rotaractors and their families
4. Evening Social—open to all and designed to promote fellowship

Set to be one of largest District Conferences in the last 25 years, 2017 is looking to host approximately eight hundred (800) registrants over the four-day event from 26th April to 29th April.
