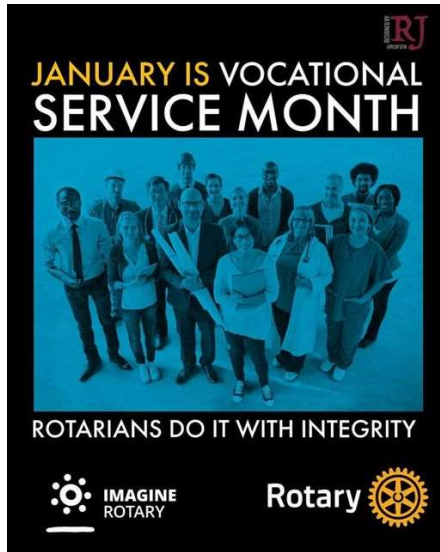

Summary of the RCoB Meeting Held on January 5th, 2023

PP Jedder Robinson as Greeter kept the attendance record. PP Erskine Thompson deputized for PP Brenda Pope; at her request; as she was committed to another meeting. Visiting Rotarian PP Tama Holve of the Rotary Club of Studio – City, Sherman Oaks, California joined early birds PDG David Edwards, PP David Antrobus and PP Denise Antrobus and engaged in fellowship in true Rotary Style consistent with her 34 years as a Rotarian.

Pres Tracey invited Rtms Heather Tull and Tamara Allman to join Sarge Randy Marshall at the Head Table. The gathering started small causing some concern but eventually attendance reached a respectable 45%. The usual singing of the National Anthem sung with great gusto followed by a Toast to Her Excellency the President of Barbados and the joint recital of the Rotary Grace were done before Pres Tracey invited Rotarians and Guests to sit.

Sarge Randy Marshall was exacting in his disciplining of the club and found enough transgressors from the gathering to exceed Pres Tracey's \$200.00 target by \$10.00. After a sumptuous buffet lunch, engaged fellowship, punctuated by bouts of raucous laughter, Pres Tracey took to the podium to address the meeting on the following matters:

1. With deep regrets Pres Tracey informed the meeting of the passing of Beverley Steele the mother of Dir Savitri St. John. The final arrangements were still being made and will be shared with the Club in due course. Members were counselled not to flood Savitri with calls at this time.

4. Rotarians were reminded that funds collected for Carols by Candlelight are to be submitted as a matter of urgency.

Before she could return to her seat it was announced that she had won the raffle. Happily holding the bottle of wine, she asked to be excused to join the Cruise Ship on her Caribbean Cruise.

The first meeting of 2023 concluded full of spirit as a Toast was offered to Rotary International.

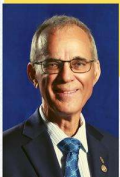
