BIO Dr. Nerissa Jurawan

2000. Graduated from the UWI and was awarded a bachelor of Medicine and Surgery.

2001 Practiced as a registrar and in Internal Medicine and Nephrology in Trinidad after completion of medical internship.

2009- 2011. Developed an interest in transplant nephrology and completed a fellowship in transplantation at the University Hospital Birmingham -2009-2011.

2016. Went on to complete higher training in nephrology with the West Midlands Deanery and was awarded The MRCP – Nephrology (UK) and the CESR- CP Nephrology UK. Upon completion of her specialist training went on to work as a consultant at the University Hospital Birmingham then migrated to Barbados where she is currently a Consultant at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital.

She has specialized in all areas of nephrology but has special interest in the following areas:

- Renal Transplantation-working with Dr O'shea and Dr Belle to re-establish the renal transplant programme on Barbados, Renal Vascular access-author of two chapters
- Pregnancy in CKD and Transplantation- conducted specialty combined renal obstetric clinics at the University Hospital Birmingham with authorship of a Chapter Rare Diseases – Developed the Tuberos Sclerosis Clinic at the Centre for Rare Diseases at the University Hospital Birmingham.
- Research interest in acute Kidney Injury with a recent paper published on Mortality with AKI. Currently conducting
- research into chronic kidney disease in Barbados.

BIO Dr. Margaret O'Shea

Dr. Margaret O'Shea completed training in General Surgery in 2006 graduating from the UWI with a Doctor of Medicine in General Surgery. She went on to undertake fellowship training in Renal Transplantation at the Princess Alexandra Hospital in Brisbane, Australia in 2008.

Dr.O'Shea returned to the QEJ in 2009 and was promoted to consultant general and renal transplant surgeon.

She was head of the Dept of surgery, QEJ between 2013 and 2016. In 2016 she joined the UWI as lecturer in Surgery and remained in post as consultant general and renal transplant surgeon at QEJ.

Quoting from her and she said "Our local transplant team since partnering with transplant links charity in 2015 has seen our dream of a sustainable renal transplant program become a reality."

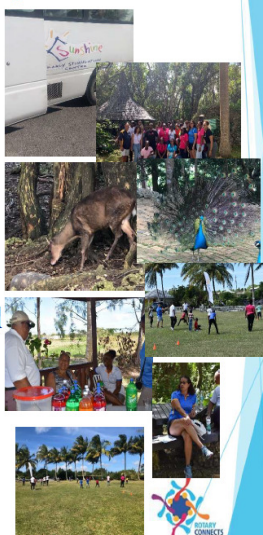
