As this was a closed meeting there were no visiting Rotarians or guests to introduce.

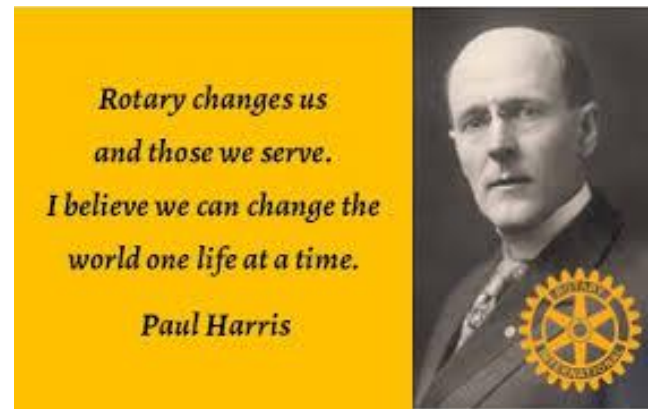

On Saturday MUN kicked off its 7th Session.

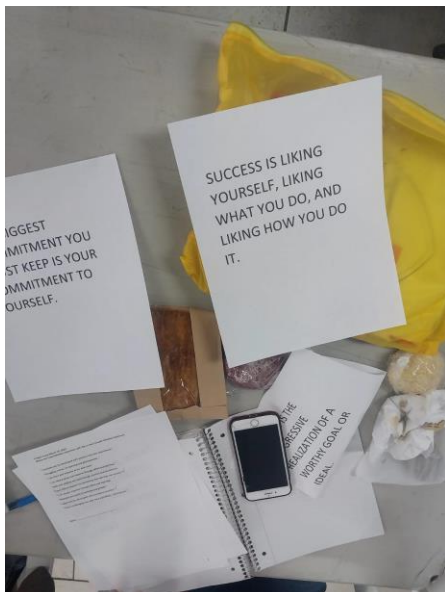
Youth Elevation Scheme (YES)
