

The logo for this year's Rotary International theme was designed by Riki Salam, a contemporary Indigenous Australian artist. The circle signifies our connections to one another. The dots around it represent people and Rotary's seven areas of focus.

The circle and the dots together become a navigation star – our

guiding light. The solid line underneath is a digging stick, used when doing hard work. And since Rotary members are people of action – it represents a tool for getting things done.

The colors are purple for polio eradication, green for our environment, and white for peace.
