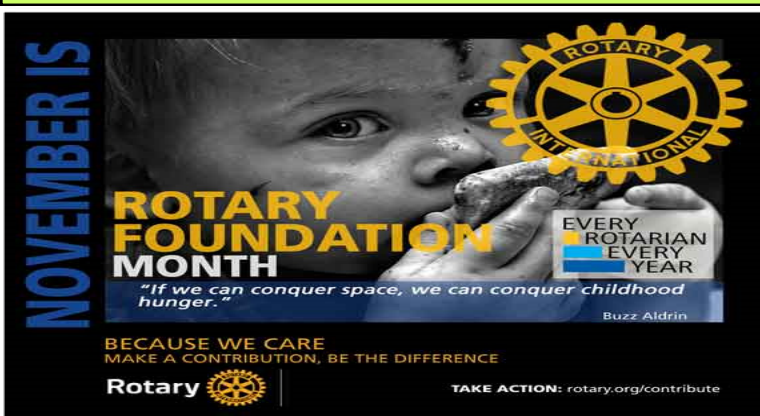

Recap Of November 07 Meeting

This was a very busy Business Meeting. There was a lot to cover. The Directors each gave their reports. Director Adrian reported on the success of the Pride of Workmanship Awards and thanked his hard-working committee. He also reported on the ongoing school sign refurbishment and the programs at the Children's Homes. Director Makonem reported on the activities of the Rotaract, Interact, and Earlyact Clubs. He spoke of the successful Earlyact 'Trick or Treat' event which was headed by Rotarian Jamela and encouraged those who missed this year's event to attend next year. He spoke about the upcoming 'Paint and Prosecco' event and complimented the Interact Club at the St. Michael School and the work of the Co-Presidents. Dir Makonem also reminded the Club of the plans which are on the way to facilitate an exchange trip between Rotaractors from Uganda and Barbados, in keeping with the Prime Minister's vision to strengthen ties between Barbados and the African Continent. Director Heather spoke about the successful recently concluded joint Polio Day event, updated the club about 4 min Rotary Foundation Videos for November and appealed for support for upcoming MUN 2020.

The club is continuing with work promoting self-sufficiency and lower garbage production, by kicking off our Sustainable living & Compositing Project.

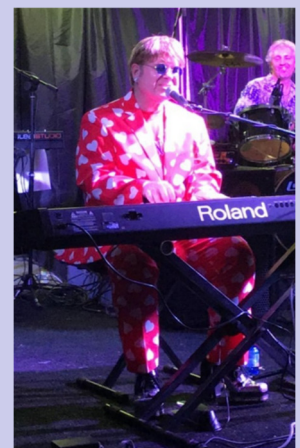

Attendance, fellowship and viewing of the update went well with good participation, and the event will be put on the calendar going forward. For the Rotary Foundation month in November, PDG David will be encouraging Rotarians to contribute to the Foundation, while the Committee will coordinate the viewing of a Rotary Foundation video, (not exceeding 4 minutes) at every meeting in November to illustrate the work of the Foundation "Doing Good in the World" MUN starts in February 2020 and members are asked to put aside every Saturday morning for 6 weeks commencing to participate, encourage and add value to the MUN process.
