Many ideas for the Club's outreach were discussed and PDG David presented the Club with his presentation entitled the Magic of Rotary as presented by PDG David Edwards. Lively discussions and debates ensued as the Club reviewed the past few months and examined the way forward. One of the initiatives discussed was the comprehensive use of the Four Way Test by the Club in promoting integrity in Barbados. This project was presented by Rtn. Peter Williams and the scope of the application of the Four Way Test is intended to vary from the private sector to the public sector to the schools.

- Two people to count the money collected from tins


