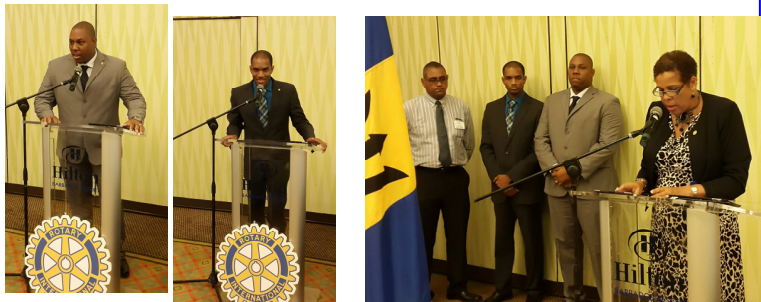
**RI THEME: ROTARY SERVING HUMANITY**

#### RTN. SHAWN FRANKLIN is President Elect for 2018-19.

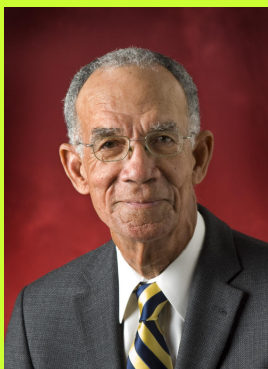

#### RTN. ANDREW NIVEN

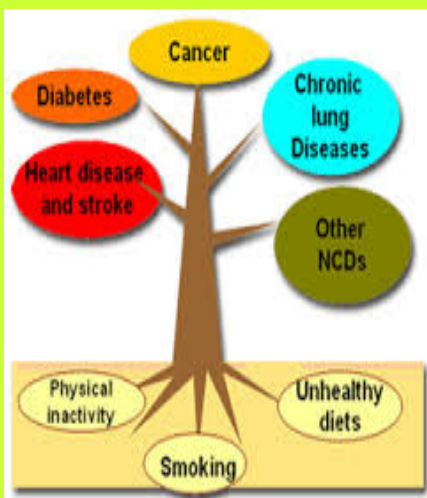
