Summary of the RCOB Meeting Held on February 8th, 2024

- Meeting was called to order at 12:30 pm
- Toast raised to Dame Sandra, President of the Republic of Barbados and Grace was said by all present.

□ SAA Randy indicated that there were no written Board reports prepared but oral presentations would be delivered by, or on behalf of, the Directors. These are summarized below:

Dir Randy – Club Administration

Attendance: Jan ~74% – members below 30% increased by 4 members. Members are encouraged to boost their attendance through participating in the numerous weekend programs such as MUN, Y.E.S., NCD project and follow up with your director to ensure that make-ups are submitted to register your attendance.

Other: Two classification talks were delivered in January with another scheduled for Feb 22 by Rtn Rachel Power. Also, on Feb 22 Hon Rtn Didier Trebucq will make a presentation. POW will be celebrated on Feb 29 and a joint club activity is being worked on to be held at the Usain Bolt stadium.

NCD project relaunched Jan 24 and so far each of the 3 days has seen 3 sessions: on Jan 24, 83 screenings were done and 36 had to be turned back. Since Sep 23 we have done 649 screenings. Client feedback has been very positive. More Rotarian participation is needed:
