

In recognition of New Leadership Month, on 20th July, Rotary-IEP Partnership Coordinator Summer Lewis will address District 7030 on Positive Peace and the relationship between Rotary and the Institute for Economics and Peace.

Access to this kick-off session is granted 15-30 minutes prior to official start time. All Rotarians and Rotaractors in District 7030 are invited to attend.

Summer currently manages Rotary International's strategic partner-ship with the Institute for Economics and Peace, overseeing the creation and messaging of tools and activities to make peace tangible and actionable for 1.2 million Rotarians worldwide. She began her Rotary journey as a university student, thanks to a Volunteer Service Grant to Guatemala – a life-changing experience that sealed her commitment to a career in international development and philanthropy, building global relationships for the greater social and economic good.

Summer was selected as a Rotary Peace Fellow and completed a Masters of International Studies, Peace and Conflict Resolution at the University of Queensland, Australia in 2012, focusing her studies on the connection between economic development and peace.
