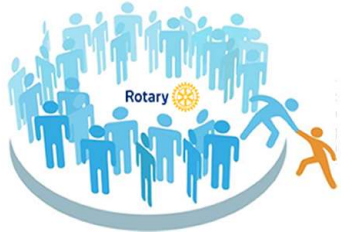

Our next scheduled meeting will be a Fellowship Meeting, to be held on August 24th, 2023, which commences at 12:30 p.m. at The Hilton Hotel.

Summary of the RCOB Meeting Held on August 10th, 2023

President Ermine called the 5th meeting of the Rotary year to order at 12:31pm.

The agenda was highlighted for the day's meeting with introductions of guests, presentation by "the Boy from Barbados" Zane Maloney, presentation on the origins of Paul Harris Fellow recognition and pinning of Paul Harris Fellows and announcement of the upcoming events.



PDG David proudly introduced "the Boy from Barbados" Zane Maloney who was accompanied by his agent Ashley Maloney. Upon introduction, Zane took the podium and shared that he is in his first season as a Formula 2 driver. Moving from Formula 3, Formula 2 season has had its difficulties and he is home to recoup, and train for the remaining 3

months of the season. He then opened the floor to be asked questions on his career thus far. Rotarians embraced the opportunity and asked Zhane the following questions which he answered:

Q1: What is the likelihood of being a Formula 1 driver in the 2024 season?

ZM: There are only 20 seats in F1, and he doesn't anticipate being in the 2024 season, it is not possible. He expressed his dream to be in the 2025 cohort of F1 drivers and is strategizing and putting in the work to achieve this.

Q2: How does he project himself as he advances in the sport?

ZM: Expressed that the sport is quite political however with drivers such as Lewis Hamilton he is able to observe "be a sponge" to learn as much as possible, training all whilst maturing in the game in order to advance himself to achieve his goal.

Q3: What does he do to stay focused?

ZM: His vision remains on his goal of being in F1 as a result each year he has progressed a level and such achievements help him to stay focused.

Q4: what does a day of training entail?

ZM: Due to the impact of the heaviness of the car and speed, there is emphasis on his cardio exercise regime to work on his heart rate such as doing a 10k run. Also given that F2 cars are heavy, the steering wheel requires strength, so he is required to also focus on strength training. He exercises numerous times during the day.

Q5: How challenging is it to get sponsorship for the sport?

ZM: The sport is very expensive and political and therefore challenging to receive sponsorship. However, he expressed his gratitude and appreciation towards his family support to be able to achieve where he is now. He also stated that to gain F1 status there is really no limitations towards sponsorship due to how expensive the sport is.

Q6: How does he prepare mentally for a race?

ZM: “laughs” and shared he is quite superstitious at times when it comes to race day. However, in general he strategizes, studies data and videos. He is aware of the different variables that can occur on the day such as weather and accidents so he needs to also keep an open mind that anything can happen and be prepared as much as possible in such instances.

Q7: What is it like being home away from racing?

ZM: He loves being home and is always at the beach (he also trains at the beach). If he wasn't racing, he would be home and enjoying his time before he has to leave again.

Q8: What type of car he likes?

ZM: He has driven, F2, F3, and F4 cars and his preference is a F3 car. He laughed that he hasn't been able to drive a Lamborghini as yet.

Q9: What kind of racing he thinks requires more skills (rally or circuit)

ZM: He thinks they are very different and requires different skills, he joked that rally drivers are wild with rally having a dangerous side as he has participated in rally and never finished a race. However, with circuit it is faster and he is of the opinion that circuit drivers are more perfectionist in that type of racing.
