

Past President Jerome 'Jerry' Ishmael



It was with a heavy heart we learnt of the passing of PP Jerry

Past President Jerome "Jerry" Ishmael joined the Club on July 22, 1999. He was introduced by PP Lionel Moe and PP Vic Fernandes.

His Classification was Event Management. Before becoming President for 2007-08 Jerry had served in

many areas of Club life. From 2001-2003 he was Director of Club Service, 2003-04 Director of Community Service. Sergeant-At-Arms 2004-05; Chairman, Public Relations 2005-06 and President Elect, Chairman Fund Raising 2006-07. For his Presidential Project he upgraded the Sir Clyde Gollop Men's Hostel at Hindsbury Road and completed the Evalina Smith Children's Ward Project at the St. Philip District Hospital which had commenced the previous year by PP Michael Browne. From 2009-2014 he served as Chairman Fellowship. He was also member of the 50th Anniversary Sub-committee. For 2014-15 he served on the following subcommittees - Fellowship, PR, Fund Raising and the Challenged/Senior Citizens. He continued to serve in various capacities including as Chair Fellowship and is a member of the Challenges/Senior Citizens, Fund Raising and PR Committees.

PP Jerry made two other significant contributions to the life of the Club:

- 1. Using his Classification, he professionalised the structure of our main Fund-Raising Event Carols by Candlelight. He brought in the Project Management Format, Critical Path Analysis where we all could see time lines Charts and individual responsibilities.
- 2. As President Elect he ushered in the new Valentine Fund-Raising event Love Unmasked, after the cessation of Bajan Night which had lost its sparkle.

Jerry's contribution to Club and Community was recognized with a Paul Harris Fellowship Award in June 2003.

PP Jerry was a Rotarian who exemplified Service Above Self.

Summary of the RCOB Meeting Held on April 11th, 2024

The 33rd Meeting of the Rotary Year commenced with The Call to Order and the Welcome by President Ermine. She indicated that notwithstanding being a Business Meeting two new members would be inducted.

President Nominee Jeff was invited to lead the National Anthem. The Toast was offered to The President and Our Patron Dame Sandra. The prayer was said by everyone.

Induction

President Ermine invited AG Paul and Director Neal to introduce the prospective members Alvaro Holder and Danielle Donawa-Spencer respectively. Both were former members of the Rotaract Club of Barbados. Following the pinning of the new members by President Ermine they were invited to address the Club.

Danielle Donawa-Spencer

"Joining the Rotary Club of Barbados is an honor and a privilege. I have served within the Rotary International family for the past 6 years as a Rotaractor and over that time I have had the opportunity to work closely with many members of RCOB, who have always been supportive and encouraging. I am extremely excited to continue a life of Service Above Self as a Rotarian and proud to do so as a member of this Club, whose members have welcomed me with open arms as one of their own, even before I was officially inducted.

Rotaract

I was inducted in April 2018 and got straight to work as the Club's Assistant Treasurer for the 2018-19 year. I subsequently served on the Board in various positions throughout my Rotaract life. I served as Secretary in 2019-20 and I took on the position of Vice President in 2020-21. I also served at the District level as Assistant District Rotaract Secretary in that year.

As acting President in the final quarter of the 2020-21 year, I spearheaded a relief project called "Love Thy Neighbor" to assist our neighbors in St. Vincent and the Grenadines after the eruption of La Soufrière volcano in June 2021. That project garnered over \$5,500.00 in monetary and in-kind support and included support from the other Rotaract Clubs on island. In the 2021-22 year I served as President-Elect and was President of the Club in 2022-23.

In my year as President, I co-chaired the planning committee for our Spirited event held on June 3, 2023. From this event we were able to donate \$5,000.00 to the Caribbean Dyslexia Association for testing and lessons for students at the Luther Thorne School. Throughout that year we were also able to donate enough funds to The Rotary Foundation to award two Paul Harris Fellows, our first 2 female awardees from the Club."
