RECAP OF BUSINESS MEETING

HELD ON AUGUST 11, 2016

BELOW ARE SUMMARIES OF THEIR REPORTS:—

Director PE Paul—FUNDRAISING CHAIR

MEET OUR GREETERS:

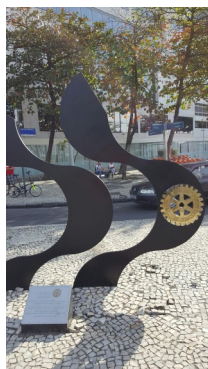

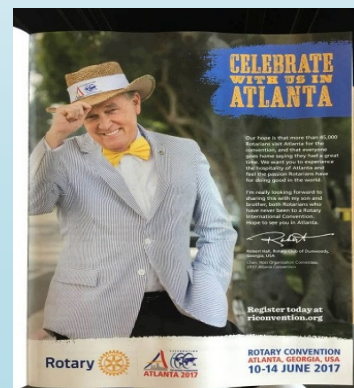
