The 9th Meeting of the Rotary Year was called to order at 12:30 pm

- Pres. Tracey called the meeting to order
- PP Jedder gave the prayer
- Sergeant-at-arms Randy then introduced our guests and visiting Rotarians
- PP Brenda gave the Rotary Foundation Minute Highlighting the "Empower Girls Now" global initiative started by RI President Mehta in 2021 and being continued by RI President Jennifer
- Pres Tracey gave an update on her project for the year "Save, Spend, Thrive" delivering financial literacy skills for women. *Phase I:* Donation of 5 computers to Marina House by Sagicor (completed). *Phase II:* In progress

- **POWA**: Date Thursday October13; Price \$155, focus is *Youth at Risk*, Awardee criteria completed; Nominations through social media campaign to be launched August 12; Sponsor tables still available

- BtBCY: Lodge School, SMS confirmed, Lester Vaughan Deighton Griffith and QC o/s, Term I – focused on theory aspects, Term II - practical aspect -"Day in the Life of an Adult" workshop and job fair
- Youth Elevation Scheme: engaged in strategic planning and design for new programme delivery in January 2023
- Satellite Club Proposal: Rotaractors/past Rotaractors too old for Rotaract; unable to join RCOB due to time/financial constraints but wish to continue Rotary journey and Rotary Experience; club intended as incubator into RCOB for 3-5 years, comprehensive research by group, pros and cons discussed with PDG Lisle Chase, chose RCOB to sponsor, only need eight persons to start have eleven.

- POWA Campaign: Integrated communication plan, creative and nomination page and flyer completed, campaign to launch August 12

- Conferences: District Grenada April 2023 target minimum of 20 persons details to follow;
 International Melbourne May 2023 15 persons already
- Joint Meetings with International Rotary Clubs: St Kitts and Kenya; dates and plans to be finalized
- **MUN 2022-23:** meeting with 3 club presidents in August re pulling delivery teams together

• PP Peter – Treasurer

- **Financial Statements:** 2021-22 reviewed and issued
- Member Dues: 88 members billed (\$22,000) half year dues, 29 members paid (\$7,250) at August 10, RI dues US\$ 3,782.50 paid by wire transfer, no invoice yet for District 7030 dues
- **Installation Dinner:** 92 persons attended, 8 Guests of the Club, 84 persons were billed, 38 paid and 46 o/s, Expenses \$17,769 => net cost to Club \$4,749.
- **Finance Committee:** proposed committee of 3 persons including Treasurer, to build capacity (i.e. familiarity with ClubRunner, Quickbooks, Club financial procedures) and for succession; 2 persons to be nominated, one willing and able to serve as Treasurer in RY 2023-2024.
- **Banking:** All payments currently by cheque, Board approved direct Bank Transfers to suppliers, Treasurer to prepare payment and two of four designated Rotarians will approve.
- Quickbooks and ClubRunner: QB on Club laptop is old and unsupported, CR now has feature to export data to Quickbooks on-line version, cost and benefits of migrating to the online QB will be investigated

- Our Zone 33/34 RI Director Jeremy Hurst is not only excited by the energy surrounding this initiative, he is also committed to identifying more Club projects and facilitate more action to empower girls.
