Summary of the RCOB Meeting Held on January 11th, 2024

Call to Order: 12:35PM

The first meeting of the year for the Rotary Club of Barbados took place with an atmosphere of camaraderie as members extended warm wishes for a happy new year. Enthusiasm filled the air as the club collectively looked forward to initiating new projects and resuming activities that were temporarily on hold. Members engaged in discussions about upcoming plans and goals, sharing excitement about potential projects on the horizon. Committee updates

provided insights into ongoing and upcoming initiatives, emphasizing coordination efforts to align projects with the club's overarching objectives. The importance of community engagement was highlighted, with members brainstorming ways to enhance the club's presence and impact in the community.

Director Randy kicked off the meeting with the first presentation, providing insightful notes on the club's attendance. In December 2023, the monthly attendance stood at an impressive 78%, with 76 active members out of a total of 97 (excluding Honorary Rotarians or the Satellite Club). Remarkably, December marked the highest attendance for the year, prompting a cheerful "HOORAY! See below dates for upcoming activities"

Expressing gratitude for the Shoe Box "Adopt A Child" activity, the message is: "A heartfelt thank you to all our members for their participation in the Shoe Box 'Adopt A Child' initiative. Your generosity and support have made a significant impact, spreading joy and making a difference in the lives of those we've reached. Thank you for your compassion and commitment to community engagement!"

Director David Antrobus delivered the second presentation, focusing on Health Literacy Education & Screening for Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs) in outlying community areas. The presentation highlighted a significant accomplishment of 463 screenings conducted to date, with an estimated value of \$600 per session, totalling \$277,800.

Over 12 sessions, a cumulative screening time of 56 hours (7 hours/day and 4 hours/1/2 day am) was achieved, averaging 8.26 screenings per hour with a capacity to accommodate 12 screenings per hour. The success of community engagement was attributed to Rotarians conducting door-to-door outreach, with 4-6 Rotarians needed per session to allow for effective rotation. Additionally, the Health Literacy & Education Impact was emphasized, spanning four sessions across three schools, benefiting approximately 120 students. The presentation underscored the positive impact of the initiative, demonstrating the Rotary Club's commitment to health education and community well-being.


