After Dominique Vénéré became governor of District 7030 in July 2018, she got a crash course in international relations and comparative politics. Her district encompasses southern Caribbean islands and several South American countries, and it has a mix of mostly French and English speakers. "I soon realized how different Guadeloupe, which is still part of France, is from other former colonies such as Antigua and Barbuda and Guyana," she says. "Now I am ready to develop relationships with the surrounding countries rather than remaining turned toward France and Europe."

As district governor, Vénéré had the opportunity to meet with heads of state. After Hurricane Maria, she talked at length with Dominica's president, Charles Savarin, about recovery efforts as well as other economic and societal issues. To top it off, she also attended the country's festivities for the 40th anniversary of its independence. "Hearing the crowd in a stadium sing their national anthem sent shivers down my spine."

District Goals

Goals for Priority 1 – Unite People

Membership

- ✓ Increase membership district-wide by 3.5%
- ✓ Each club
 - Achieve a net gain of at least 1 member
 - Improve membership retention rate by at least 1%, if below 90%, or maintain rate, if 90% or higher
 - Achieve net gain in female members, or in members below age 40*.

Family of Rotary

- ✓ Expand the family of Rotary
- ✓ Each club
 - Sponsor a new Rotaract, Interact or Earlyact club, if none already sponsored

Goals for Priority 2 – Take Action

Foundation

- ✓ Goal of \$400,000 for year
- ✓ Each Club
 - Contribute minimum US\$100 per member to Annual Fund
 - Contribute minimum of US\$1,500 to Polio Plus
 - Achieves at least 1 new PHS member or gives at least 1 new PHF
 - Have a minimum of 2 members attend District Foundation Seminar
 - Appoint a Club Foundation Director before July 1st, 2019
 - Assign Foundation goals in Rotary Club Central before July 1st, 2019

Public Image

- ✓ Raise awareness of the brand and image of Rotary and promote Rotarians as 'People of Action'
- ✓ Each Club
 - Post details of successful projects on club's, district's and RI's websites
 - Use Rotary's brand guidelines, templates, People of Action campaign materials, and related resources
 - Arrange for the club's emblems to talk with the media to tell your club's and Rotary's story
 - Appoint a Club Public Image/Public Relations Committee before July 1, 2019
 - Assign POI goals in Rotary Club Central before July 1, 2019

Projects

- ✓ 2 special projects – Youth at Risk and diabetes
- ✓ Each Club
 - To undertake 1 project focused on youth at risk
 - To undertake 1 project focused on the prevention and/or treatment of Diabetes
 - Report the contribution to service projects in cash and in volunteer hours in Rotary Club Central
