June 11 Classification Talk Rtn. Barbara Trieloff- Deane



President Peter, fellow Rotarians, I'd like to open my classification talk with phrase from a well-known statesman as it encompasses my philosophy—"the significance of our lives is measured by the difference we make in the lives of others". The principles of that philosophy have been the touchstone in my professional life as well as in passion for giving back to the community.

Born on an island in the Pacific under the jurisdiction of Canada, while my parents were travelling, I am Bajan bred and raised...and attended Queen's College. My parents had immigrated to Barbados, with my father working at the old Barbados general hospital. I also married into an old Bajan family. Bill, my partner in service is an educational assistant, with a focus on students with special needs.

My professional practice as a business consultant has its foundation in banking and brokerage, with expertise in the design, development and implementation of strategic initiatives, including associated communications and training and development. As a faculty member for the Canadian Credit Union Association, I deliver professional development programs to commercial banking advisors and leaders.

My career started when on Black Monday, I signed up for the Canadian Securities Course. Since that historic date, I advanced through wealth advisory, senior leadership and executive roles as Vice President Learning & Development with Qtrade Financial Group; Director CIBC Retail Markets Training & Development; General Manager-CIBC Imperial Service and Director-CIBC Commercial Banking, including working on the First Caribbean Bank integration team. I also served on the IROC Education & Proficiency Committee, the Certification and Education Committees for the Financial Planning Standards Council Certification and the Canadian Institute of Financial Planning.

Parallel to this is my passion for giving back to Barbados and the Barbadian diaspora in Canada, having served in many capacities: Director, The Substance Abuse Foundation; President and Director of Barbados Ball Canada Aid; Vice President of Big Brothers and Big Sisters of York; youth mentor at Covenant House; speaker for United Way Speakers Bureau presenting to TSX, American Express, Town of Markham and in York Regional Government; volunteer at Nightingale Home; and Scholarship Patron of The Caribbean Event. I am also Editor-in-Chief of "Beyond Rum & Saltfish", a commemorative volume celebrating Barbados' 50th Anniversary of Independence and Canada's 150th; and Editor of "The Caribbean Event 20th Anniversary".

My interest in Rotary is to apply my skills and passion, "united in the ideal of service", to making a difference through Rotary projects that are scalable, sustainable and have social impact.
