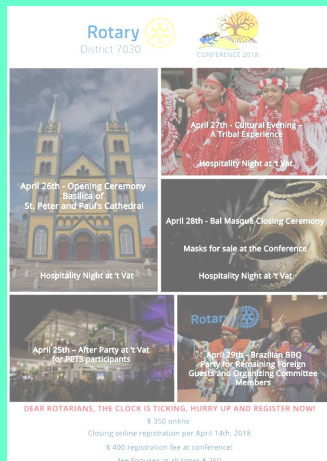

Young Hanna at the age of 13 was the recipient of a BIOTRONIK device which was implanted in December 2017. Hannah's surgery was successful and thanks to Heartbeat International.

Heartbeat International is a charity organisation whose goal this year is to save at least 600 lives. This Charity began with the help of a US\$261,200 Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) Grant from The Rotary Foundation, in 1984. Over the years, senior Rotary leaders including past RI presidents have been instrumental in the Charity and in the distribution of pacemakers through a network of Rotary Clubs.
