Did you know that:

- In 1957 the Paul Harris Fellow Recognition Institute was established?
 - It acknowledges individuals who contribute or have contributions made in their name, of \$1,000 to the Rotary Foundation.
 - Donors may also name another person as a Paul Harris Fellow by donating in his/her name.
 - It was established to encourage and show appreciation for substantial contributions to the Foundation or contribution to society.
 - By 2006 they were 1 million PHF's).
- In 1963 the Matched District and Club Program was started?
 - This program paired districts & clubs to work together on service projects. This approach was later adopted for Matching and Global grants.
