BIO of Rotarian Adrian Skeete

Adrian Skeete is a business owner in the ICT and systems integrator space, and he has been happily married to Harriette Skeete for the past ten years.



They have two children together Annaleyah who is 7 and Bellamarie who is 2 years old. Adrian was born and raised in the UK, by a Jamaican mother and Barbadian father. He was raised as a Catholic, and attended All Saints Roman Catholic School in Dagenham Essex. While there he competed in

sports and excelled in cricket, he later would go on to represent the county of Essex at the U17 level.

After graduating from school, Adrian went on to attend South Bank University London where he received a BA in Business, majoring in Management Information Systems with upper second class honors. During his 3 years at university Adrian worked and studied and was employed by several blue chips companies such as Nike Town and GAP. After completing his degree he was compelled to learn more about the IT industry and he was successful in completing his Microsoft Certifications.

In 2003 he moved to Barbados with his then partner Harriette Skeete, and they moved with the hope of building a foundation and to help them to define their goals and purpose.

He worked as the IT Manager for On Line Consultancies Ltd. (retail IT company), for seven years. Realising that there was no more room for growth, Adrian applied for the position of General Manager for the Jada construction group and was successful and remained there for 2 years, before deciding to start his own ICT Company, S-Tech Solutions, specializing in ICT, Security, CCTV, and AV Integration.

Adrian has always wanted to give back, especially to the youth. He wanted to combine his passion for helping, with his passion for football and when an opportunity came in 2005 to do that, he jumped at it and joined the Barbados Football Referees Association. Due to his hard working ethic, talents, professionalism, love for refereeing and football the Barbados Football Association, moved him swiftly into officiating into the higher divisions.

In 2011 Adrian realised one of his dreams and became a FIFA International Referee, and has since been to tournaments throughout North America, Central America, and Caribbean region representing Barbados at the highest levels of football, and has been ranked in the top 5 referees in the Caribbean.

TIPS FOR COPING WITH DYSLEXIA!



“Dyslexia is a specific learning difficulty that mainly affects the development of literacy and language related skills.

It tends to be resistant to conventional teaching methods, but its effect can be mitigated by appropriately specific intervention, including the application of information technology and supportive counseling.

Here are seven tips of how you can live successfully with your dyslexia:

- 1) **Practice, practice & practice reading**-For some, audio reading solutions can help in improving their reading capabilities.
- 2) **Gain your writing independence**- Find the right writing assistive solutions!
- 3) **Keep up to date of new technologies/inventions** -The internet provides a direct route to knowledge of all new findings and developments for dyslexics.
- 4) **Know when is the right time to “divulge” your dyslexia** – Dyslexia is not a disease, but there are quite a few misconceptions that people have about dyslexia. Fine-tune your detection capabilities to determine when is the best time to share with others your “dyslexic” condition.
- 5) **Re-gain your social confidence**– many times dyslexics attending regular educational institutes lose their social confidence during their school years
- 6) **Learn your strengths** –Dyslexics usually boast of high intelligence and “big-picture” / strategic thinking. Learn your strengths, as these must be leveraged in your real-life struggles to compete with those common non-dyslexics!
- 7) **Never ever ever give up** – You must always believe in your abilities and to quote the famous Charlie Brown – simply “Never ever ever give up”. The world is full of people who have lost because they simply gave up.


