Several Directors presented their reports to the Club allowing for discussion on projects for the upcoming Rotary year.

outlined her plans for the International Service committee and reported on previous projects.

INTERNATIONAL SERVICE

The Director proposed that introductory meetings wil be held with the following development partners and countries among others:

- European Union
- Department For International Devolopment
- US Embassy
- High Commission of Canada.

Planning has begun for the hosting of the Second Model UN Assembly (MUN) which was previously held to great success. This will be a joint project among the three clubs. It is proposed that the MUN be hosted to cover all public and secondary schools up to a maximum of 4 students per team.

Based on the UN concept, the Rotary Club has an opportunity to develop GLOBAL CITIZENS through a project which prepares young future leaders for international careers. It was noted that at previous MUNs, students aspiring to be environmental science majors, film industry and law aspirants all tried to see how they could choose academic courses after the MUN that would allow them to have an international career either in the UN system or another international organization. The Rotary has an ideal opportunity through the Youth Service and International Service Avenues of Service to develop a student development program which:

- ☐ Expands the scope of MUN to create an annual 'Academy' for secondary school students which exposes them to international careers,
- ☐ Affords students exposure to a wide range of international careers through building partnerships,
- ☐ Develops partnerships with local and international agencies/organizations which can identify scholarships and exchange programs for students,
- ☐ Trains future leaders for excellence, and
- ☐ Exposes students to cultural, political and geographical differences.

This project will significantly raise the profile of the Rotary Club in the young generation and build a profile of the Club among possible future leaders and future Rotarians. Additionally, the Interact and Rotaract Clubs will benefit from increased presence of the Rotary Club in the school system and there is expected consequential spill over in potential membership for these two clubs.

At the end of their time in the 'Academy' students would have gleaned a greater understanding of their options for careers globally, the possibility of dedicating their careers to international development and how this all ties in with the Rotary motto of 'Service Above Self'.



INTERNATIONAL NEWS

Rotary has approved a US\$500,000 Rapid Response grant to address a recent polio outbreak in Somalia.

As of 14 August 2013, there have been 110 cases of wild poliovirus reported in the Horn of Africa- 100 cases in Somalia, and 10 cases in Kenya. The outbreak in Somalia occurred in the Banadir Region of the country, where a large number of children had not been vaccinated against polio due to inaccessibility. This is the first outbreak in Somalia since 2007 and in Kenya since 2011.

The Rotary grant to the World Health Organization will cover operational costs, including human resources, training, and transportation of health workers during August immunization activities aimed at reaching children under 10 in all accessible areas of Somalia. To date, five vaccination campaigns have been held in Somalia, three in Kenya, two each in Ethiopia and Yemen and one in Djibouti. Additional campaigns are planned through the end of the year.

Until polio is eradicated, outbreaks are anticipated and a plan for addressing them has been built into the long term strategy for the program, which includes a rapid response activity based on lessons learned from previous outbreaks. As a result, the first vaccination round was held within a week of confirmation of the first case. Rotary has provided emergency funding for this and other outbreaks, which has been critical to ensuring that immunization activities proceed without interruption and to minimizing the risk of further international spread.

This is the second year that the Rotary Club of Barbados assisted in this community outreach project with the Campers of the Youth of Mission Camp "Rewired-JOLT 2013". The RCoB assisted in the area of providing materials, transferring of skills and coordination of the project.

The Evalina Children's Home is an ongoing project of the Rotary Club of Barbados while the Thelma Vaughan Memorial home has been assisted by the Club over the years.
