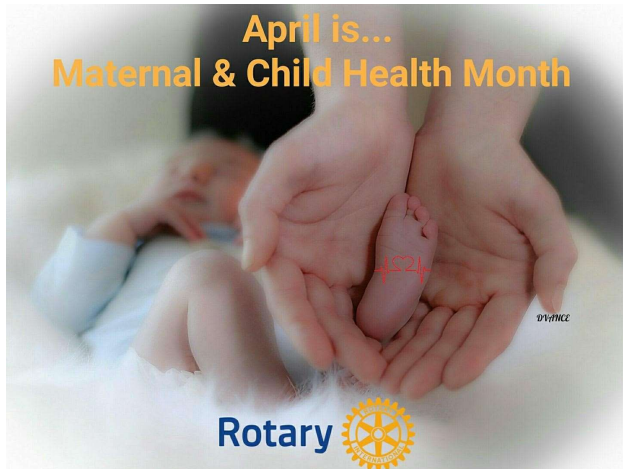

Guest Speaker - Steven Williams

He currently serves as the Executive Director of Sunisle Technology Solutions, a leading IT consulting firm. In addition, over the last two years, he has been the principal consultant of Data Privacy

and Management Advisory Services, where he has focused on driving better data privacy and cybersecurity practices within businesses.

Steven's expertise is highly regarded, with a Master of Business Administration from the University of Durham and key certifications, including Chief Information Security Officer from the EC Council and Data Protection Officer from the Professional Evaluation and Certification Board (PECB).
