

Today, Thursday, January 20, 2022 will be a **Fellowship Meeting** for the club.


The meeting which commences at 12:30 p.m. will ONLY be presented via Zoom.

SUMMARY OF THE FELLOWSHIP MEETING HELD ON JANUARY 13, 2022

- President Robin opened the 27th regular meeting of the club for the Rotary year
- The National Anthem was played
- Rtn. Tamara Allman (pictured right) gave the opening prayer.
- SAA Randy introduced our visitors for today which are listed on page 2A
- Pres Robin made the customary announcements of birthdays and anniversaries: please see Pg4A
- The Founders Day Service has been set for February 27th at 10.30 a.m. at The Roman Catholic St. Dominic Church, Maxwell. The maximum persons allowed in the church are 75. Twenty (20) Rotarians who are not parishioners are allowed to register to attend in person. Please contact Secretary Ermine if you wish to attend. The service will be live streamed.
- We are expecting a VAT refund from the water tank project. With this refund we will assess Fredrick Smith, Princess Margaret, Foundation and Lester Vaughan schools. The ministry has prioritized these schools that are in the most need of the water tank project. There are 21 secondary school on Barbados.
- The board have been in contact with the Hilton re face-to-face meetings. The clients are responsible for ensuring that 70% of those attending meetings are vaccinated. The situation is being monitored.
- The Rotary Minute was given by Rtn Roger. Rotary Peace Fellowships.

Board Updates

Carols by Candlelight – Thanks were given to all those Rotarians that helped with ensuring the event was a success. Tickets for both shows were fully sold out. There is approx. \$4,000 outstanding monies still to be collected. Tentative date for post mortem and complete accounting is January 27th. A template will be submitted for future planning of the event. Members are welcome to submit any items they wish included in the PM.

Club Administration – Club bulletin produced weekly. Attendance for year to date 73.3%. Archives – Dropbox to be used for storage. Work on club manuals continues. Scanning app selected for physical archives. Archive list soon to be submitted to the board. December's fellowship included a dine around experience and a rousing karaoke session during the Christmas lunch meeting. For this quarter's fellowship a quiz night, Easter Monday scavenger hunt are proposed. We need to fill 5 fellowship meetings this quarter. Proposed speakers: Jan 17th Miles Weekes to give presentation on 'Mediation/Alternative Dispute Resolution'; 27th Jan Rev Dr. John Rogers will give a presentation on 'The Role of Religion in Barbados'.

YES program delayed due to elections and Omicron spike. Due to covid Helping Hands at Will's Primary School non active. Little Hearts Earlyact Club at Charles F. Broome School, their Charter is due to be officially signed off this week. Rotaract Club at UWI have several projects ongoing. St. Michael School Interact Club has new project 'Charity Starts at Home' and a few other active projects.

International Committee - Push continues for Polio, Foundation and EREY funds. Foundation training courses for club members will be done at a club meeting at least once quarterly. District conference in person in April, International Conference in Houston June 4th-8th. In person MUN still undecided. TBD pending RCOB childhood Obesity project.

Expecting Zoom meeting re Blood Bank next week. Shoebox gifts were delivered to the Nightingale Children's Village. Childcare board utilized remaining child gifts from Carols by Candle Light. Looking to raise funds for sporting/activity equipment/goods. Pending Initiatives – Environment Clean Dream Program, POWA virtual format like last year, Last Mile plan to reuse last year's format.

Club financial update - Treasurer Peter announced that everyone should have received their latest billing for January-June 2022.

Citation update -We are doing well with the club citation, outstanding - we need 7 new members. We need 6 new member sponsorships. Annual fund stands at \$6,416.00; we need \$9,000. Polio: we have \$1,000 we need \$1,500.00. We need another 5 social activities; this is low due to the current situation. We are aiming for the DG citation which has been revised by DG Sonya.






