On December 14 we welcomed the Right Reverend Archbishop Elect of Port of Spain, Trinidad and Tobago, Bishop Jason Gordon. Bishop Jason addressed us on Integrity and the essence of integrity both at a national level and a personal level.



With references ranging from our Na-

tional Anthem to the Four Way Test, Bishop Jason noted that integrity can be seen in the drafting of both the Anthem and the four way test noting that "every journey begins with a single step in the right direction"

He commenced his thought provoking discussion by asking the question "what is our value system based on and have we reversed the value system to one of crude materialism and hedonism".

He noted that the road to integrity is one where a self determination has to be made to understand choice—whether we want to pursue the life of pleasure or



whether we wish to choose the road that makes a positive difference for others.

The Archbishop Elect used the dictionary definition of the word "integrity" and noted that at the end of the day our life's choices are about the kind of person we are and the person we are becoming or wish to become.

From Captain to cook—everyone has a role to play in the integrity discussion E.g.. When we don't work a full day what is that? When we give or take bribes—what is that? When we don't pay our taxes—what is that? Are we honest with ourselves in our daily lives ?

In order for us to appreciate that integrity touches each and everyone of us, we must remember that we need to teach the norms of integrity to all citizens.

Archbishop Elect, we sincerely thank you for your address and will continue to play our role in teaching positive values for a

better tomorrow. To borrow the below quote from the Bishop we aim to remember that

"all private property has a social mortgage"


