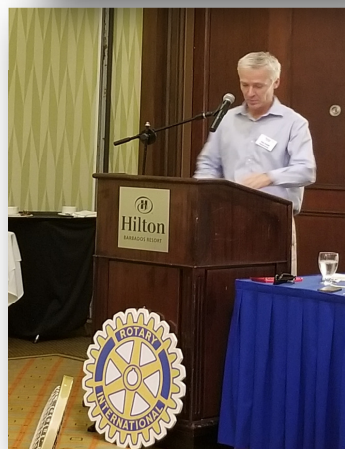

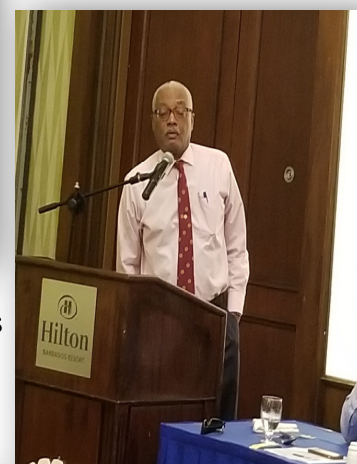

Today's guest speaker

Whycliffe (Dave) Cameron is the president of Cricket West Indies (formerly the West Indies Cricket Board WICB). He is the 16th president of this body and has held this position since 2013. Prior to holding the position of president of the WICB he held the position of vice president from 2007 to 2013.

He was a Sunlight and Tappin Cup player in the 1980s and is remembered as a destructive middle order batsman and fearless off-spinner. Described as the complete sportsman, he has excelled at almost every sport he has played. His first time representing Jamaica in sport was not in cricket, but at the World Championships in pistol shooting in South Africa in 2002. He also excels in squash and golf. He is ambidextrous, he writes, swings the golf club and bowls off spin with his right hand and bats and fires his shotgun with his left hand.

Mr. Cameron graduated from the University of the West Indies with a BSc in Hotel Management, first class honours and later obtained a Master's of Science Degree in Computer-based Management Information Systems. He has held professional positions at two of Jamaica's premier luxury resorts and in his earlier years, was the manager of the Dunn's River Falls attraction in Ocho Rios.

He has had a successful career in Finance and is the Founder and CEO of Infiniti Capital Jamaica Ltd., a Licensed Securities Dealer in Jamaica. He is also the husband of Connie Cameron with whom he has four children.
