Digging through history to find out why the Rotary year starts 1 July




Dollars and some good financial sense are why the Rotary year starts 1 July – at least that's what the RI auditors said, according to 1912-13 RI President Glenn C. Mead's report in the September 1913 issue of *The Rotarian*.

The auditors found that the organization's affairs had been managed "honestly and carefully." Still, RI was growing and had recently become an international organization, and its needs were changing.

The secretary and treasurer needed more time to prepare, audit, and check the organization's financial statements by the end of the calendar year. The auditors recommended that the organization close its financial books for the year on 30 June, which was after the RI Convention. The Board of Directors agreed, and ever since, the Rotary year has begun on 1 July.

Pope a first

MEMBERS OF THE ROTARY CLUB OF BARBADOS made history a week ago when they installed Brenda Pope as their first female president.

In her address, Pope said that the entry of women into Rotary had served to strengthen and widen the pool of potential leaders. She said over the next year the club would continue its drive to attract younger male and female members from occupations that would widen the club's classification index.

Speaking about the initiatives for this year, Pope said cancer continued to take its toll on Barbadians each year, pancreatic cancer in particular, highlighted by Prime Minister David Thompson's tragic death last year.

She noted, however, that breast cancer remained the most common cause of death among Barbadian women and many people were not aware that about four new cases a week were diagnosed, with an average of one death per week.

The good news is that even though the number of new cases each week is the same, the survival rate has improved largely due to early detection. (**RL**)
