JUNE IS ROTARY FELLOWSHIP MONTH

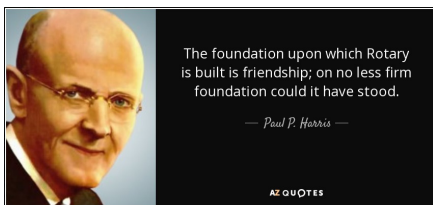

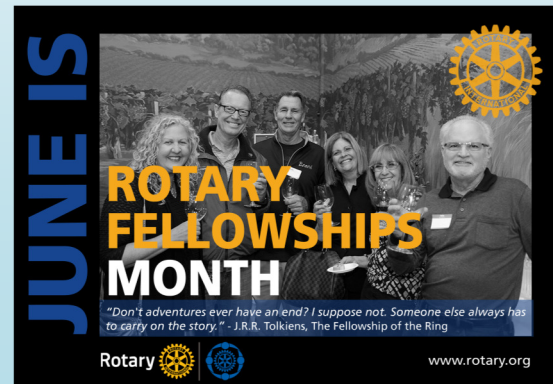
