Today the balance remaining will be donated to the "little Pink Gift" Foundation and Partner- In-Service Andrea MacKenzie, is a founding member of the Charity

Out of one person's fight comes a place where everyone can find help.

The Little Pink Gift Foundation was established in October 2010 by Lynda Lewis, a breast cancer survivor, and her 2 daughters. The foundation provides financial assistance to individuals in Barbados for their diagnosis and treatment procedures for Breast Cancer.

Breast Cancer is the most common form of cancer found in women throughout the world. With early diagnosis and accurate testing procedures, the survival rates from this disease are extremely high. It is imperative therefore, for women to receive prompt, accurate and thorough care.

While individuals may qualify for public healthcare support, not only do they encounter significant time delays in diagnosis and treatment, but in many cases the specific drugs needed to adequately treat the disease are not on the Government formulary, and the cost of these drugs is prohibitively expensive. LPG aims to help supplement these expenses.
