Summary of the RCOB Meeting Held on March 14th, 2024

President Ermine opened the meeting at 12:30 pm with the singing of the National Anthem and the Rotary Grace.

Guests were introduced, and the President Ermine pinned three Paul Harris Fellows – PP Jedder, Paul Harris Fellow +2, PP Erskine, Paul Harris Fellow + 2 and PP Robin, Paul Harris Fellow +3. President Ermine thanked them for their contribution to the Foundation. She informed the members that there were now 56 Paul Harris Fellows in the Club, one being in the Satellite Club.

President Ermine then thanked those Rotarians who have been helping weekly with the YES Program and the Heath Screening Program, and Director Randy for last Sunday's Founder's Day Fellowship Event at the home of PDG David and PIS Donna.

Lunch was then served.

After lunch President Ermine introduced PDG David with a reading of his extensive bio.

PDG David spoke to the Club on "Being a Rotarian".

PDG David will have been a Rotarian for 46 years on 11th April. He shared with the Club his philosophy, which was to be involved in the Club and its projects.

PDG David became a Rotarian in Grenada, where immediately on joining the Club, he was given the attendance register, as a means of getting to know the members, each of whom would be called every week and reminded to attend.

PDG David returned to Barbados in early 1979 when the Bank where he worked exited Grenada due to the political situation present on the island at the time. On his return, he became a member of the Rotary Club of Barbados. He had just opened his business but was thrown directly into the Chain Link Project, which he worked on every week until it came off in November 1979.

He was asked to be President of the Club in 1981, but did not take up the offer until 10 years later.

He was involved in the hosting of a District Conference on only 4 weeks' notice when it had to be moved from Suriname, but with the assistance of Rotary West they pulled off a successful event at Sam Lord's Castle.

PDG David told the Club that members need to know the families and Partners in Service of their fellow Rotarians in

the Club – that this is an important part of being a member. One must contribute to the Club, and not be a RINO.

He himself told of getting involved with the Club's disaster relief efforts, with which he is still involved. He told the Club about the first disaster relief effort with which he was involved, the first Montserrat eruption, when relief items were sent using a borrowed skyvan plane operated by the Barbados Defense Force.

PDG David said that disaster relief might sometimes look easy on the outside, but there are many considerations not seen up front. Raising funds is actually the easy part. He shared his memories of one of the worst disasters he has assisted with, Hurricane Ivan in Grenada in 2004. He spoke about displacement of people who had lost businesses and homes, but described the spirit of the Rotarian in Grenada who was leading the effort there, with no roof on most of his house, but who deferred receiving help himself because others needed it more. This, PDG David said, was the spirit of a Rotarian.

Since PDG David was District Governor up till today, together with PP Lionel who was his District Treasurer he still has control of the disaster relief funds raised by our District, and they have kept careful records and can say how all of the money raised has been spent.

On the International front, PDG David says it has been an honour to have served, but this has its challenges, when one sees the problems in other regions. He told the Club it can hold its own in any part of world with the service it gives, and encouraged Rotarians to come out and help.

SAA Heather then disciplined the Club, and photos and video clips of last Sunday's Founder's Day Fellowship Event at the home of PDG David and PIS Donna were displayed.


President Ermine announced birthdays and anniversaries and the upcoming week's announcements.




