President Paul has indicated that the Rotary Clubs in Barbados have purchased 1280 gallons of water which is to be carried by the Barbados Coast Guard to Dominica by boat.

President Paul has further indicated that following a meeting of the Presidents of the three clubs the Family fun day as planned for this Sunday Sep 24 will continue but with a new objective namely to raise funds through raffles and otherwise to assist with continued contributions to the hurricane relief efforts.


