ROTARY INTERNATIONAL NEWS. Continued this week are extracts from one of the presentations at the convention. Today's extract features CYBER BULLYING AND THE FOUR WAY TEST and is taken from the RI Website.

Given our own anti cyber bullying project and the recent initiative to take the Four Way Tests to our schools, the below extract makes for interesting reading and is entitled "Teaching the Four-Way Test to Youth to Decrease Bullying" and moderated by Marsha Hunt.

In her power point presentation the following was noted:

1. Teaching the Four Way Test in Schools to Decrease Bullying

2. 1. Is It The Truth 2. Is It Fair To All Concerned 3. Will It Build Goodwill and Belter Friendships 4. Will It Be Beneficial To All Concerned3.

3. WHY WHEN WHO WHAT HOW EFFECTS

4. According to the National Education Association, PACER Center, and StopBullying.gov Why – Bullying (And Other Reasons)

5. 1 in 7 students in grades K – 12 are either a bully or have been a victim of bullying.

6. An estimated 160,000 U.S. children miss school every day due to fear of attack or intimidation by other students.

7. 83% of girls and 79% of boys report experiencing harassment.

8. Six out of 10 teenagers say they witness bullying in school once a day. 6 out of 10

9. • 35% of kids have been threatened online. 35%

10. 57% of boys and 43% of girls reported being bullied because of religious or cultural differences.

11. 64% of children who were bullied did not report it.

12. Nearly 70% of students think schools respond poorly to bullying.

13. One out of every 10 students who drop out of school does so because of repeated incidents of bullying

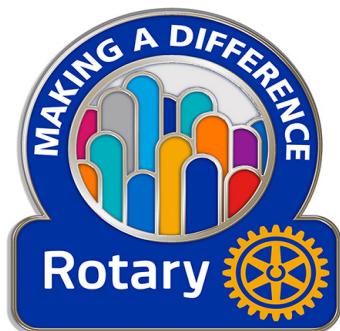

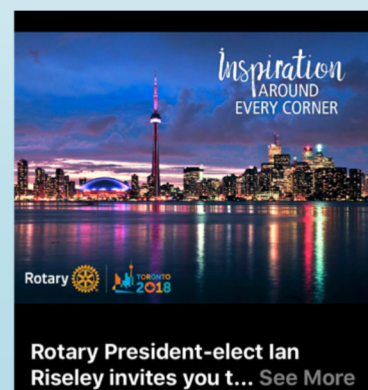
