ROTARY YOUTH LEADERSHIP AWARDS (RYLA)

What is it?

Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) is an intensive leadership experience organized by Rotary clubs and districts where you develop your skills as a leader while having fun and making connections.

What are the benefits?

Connect with leaders in your community and around the world to:

Build communication and problem-solving skills

Discover strategies for becoming a dynamic leader in your school or community

Learn from community leaders, inspirational speakers, and peer mentors

Unlock your potential to turn motivation into action Have fun and form lasting friendships

What is involved?

RYLA events are organized locally by Rotary clubs and districts for participants ages 14-30. Depending on community needs, RYLA may take the form of a one-day seminar, a three -day retreat, or a weeklong camp. Typically, events last 3-10 days and include presentations, activities, and workshops covering a variety of topics.

Communities host RYLA event for secondary school students to hone their leadership potential, for university students to develop creative problem-solving strategies, or for young professionals to learn ethical business practices.

How can persons get involved?

RYLA participants are nominated by local Rotary clubs. RYLA helps to energize the next generation of community leaders through Rotary Youth Leadership Awards, helps young people develop their potential as service-minded leaders, energizes and inspires Rotary clubs and can challenge RYLA event organizers to discover their own power to be influential community leaders.

The Rotary Clubs of Barbados have been asked to host the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA), in May 2019.
