Rotary Invited to Participate

The Government of Barbados has requested the participation of Rotary in the 'We Plantin' project, part of a national initiative to build sustainability, resilience and food security. At a recent meeting with the Honorable Colin Jordan MP, Minister of Labour and Social Partnership Relations, he asked that the service clubs engage in this national effort. The Honorable, Trevor Prescod, Environment and National Beautification Minister, speaking at the launch of the project', said that "... from here on to the end of the year, apart from what is organized at the level of the Ministry of the Environment, we're asking individuals to plant a tree."

Rotary and trees have a long history. When Rotary's president emeritus, Paul Harris traveled during the 1920s and 1930s, the nature-loving Harris planted trees to symbolize goodwill and friendship. In the fall of 1932, Harris embarked on a five-week tour of European Rotary clubs, planting "Friendship Trees" along the way. As many Rotarians may recall, our Club planted trees in the National Botanical Gardens at Waterford to commemorate our 50th anniversary year in 2012.

We are now asking that every Rotarian play their part by planting at least three trees this year. Further, any Rotarian interested in coordinating a Club effort is asked to contact President Peter or Director Adrian.
