Dr. Brathwaite completed her undergraduate medical training at the University of The West Indies in 1996 and went on to do postgraduate training in the Department of Medicine at The Queen Elizabeth Hospital Barbados. It was there her interest in Diabetes Care was sparked through the unnecessary complications and suffering she witnessed as a result of Diabetes. These experiences encouraged her to pursue further lines of enquiry and study in this area in the United Kingdom through post graduate studies and practice in the field of Diabetes and Endocrinology for several years. While there she also had the opportunity to work in multidisciplinary Diabetes Care Centers in Jersey (Channel Islands) and Yorkshire. Dr. Brathwaite returned to Barbados in November 2013 to take on the role of Clinical Director at the newly formed multidisciplinary Diabetes Centre in Barbados under management of The Barbados Diabetes Foundation.

Though every area related to diabetes admittedly interests her, she is drawn to empowerment practices and has also developed a keen interest and participatory role in Childhood Obesity Prevention in Barbados

Dr Brathwaite strongly believes in helping all persons attain a position of empowerment and understanding in relationship to their health and more specifically diabetes. Dr. Brathwaite's experience as a professionally trained dancer encourages her to promote wellness, movement and exercise as tools accessible and necessary for all persons regardless of physical and mental capacity.
