Professor Landis also discussed with the Club the importance of eating healthy and the importance of ensuring that portion sizes are controlled and that care is taken when eating processed foods. An easy pointer to healthy foods in his view were those foods which are brightly coloured—reds, greens, yellow (including spices such as turmeric) add healthy variety to every meal.

OUR FOCUS TODAY IS ON THE HEART!

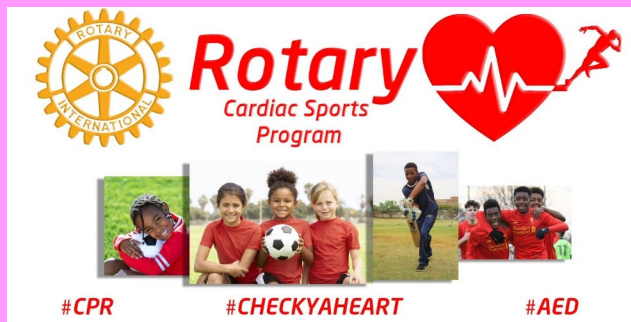
1. Today we will focus on our Cardiac Sports Program. Our invited guests Regal Development Solutions will educate us on Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) symptoms and prevention methods.

The objectives of the project are to:

1. Educate the public on SCA, and heart related diseases
2. Diagnose the diseases associated with SCA in our young sportsmen and women
3. Provide the tools needed to save the lives of those in our community.

The meeting will see objectives one and three met, by our partners, Regal Development Solutions, in making an experts presentation on Sudden Cardiac Arrest, its symptoms, and how to prevent cardiac challenges by keeping your heart healthy.

The RCoB will presenting our first Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) machine to the President, Barbados Football Association.
